### Parent Governor Vacancy

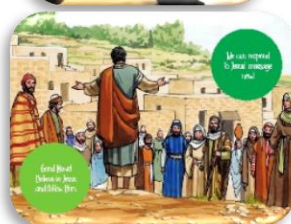
We have a parent governor vacancy. Mrs Maguire has sent out a letter via School Spider, if you are interested.
